veryone knows the number of people experiencing homelessness is at a record high," Paula says. "I know the challenge can sometimes seem too big but I can put my hand on my heart and say that your support makes a world of difference to someone sleeping on the streets. It's a lifeline that transforms despair into hope. And while we may not be able to end the crisis, your help means that anyone who needs MOI's support will receive it. For as long as it takes – offering a kind word, a hot meal, support to find accommodation and hope.

Because together, through this MOI family, that's what we do.

Helping keep doors open

Your generosity and compassion are in my thoughts every day. It's just amazing... the miracles you make happen. In the face of such strong demand for homeless day-services, you help to keep MQI's doors open. For people arriving to our door in

crisis, not knowing where they'll find a secure bed for the night -- you ensure a hot meal and a warm welcome. And it's over cups of tea that clients open-up and we can begin to help."

She continues "At MQI, everybody is valued and treated with dignity: older men, entrenched in homelessness from decades

lost, vulnerable young people finding their way here for help and women carrying emotional





Stand out moments

When I asked Paula about the clients that stood out to her in 2022, it reminded her of Patrick. Barely out of his teens and struggling to heal his chaotic childhood and cope with the harsh reality of homelessness.

"When I first met him, Patrick was hurting, shy and completely lost – but full of potential." says Paula. "Your kindness meant he could access our Young Persons
Support Programme. At the
darkest time of his life, we were
able to be there to support him.
And although he is still in
emergency accommodation, he is
actively building a new future for
himself. I've no doubt his future
will be bright, and we'll be with
him every step of the way – as will
you. Because that's what family is
– a constant support system when
you need it most. If you could see
him now... see your donations at
work, you'd be so proud.

Paula wants you to know how much that means.


