## **Beneath this Riverbank Roof**

#### A look inside the safe haven your generosity has built for Ireland's homeless:

On virtually every day and every hour of the year at MQI's Riverbank homeless centre, your support keeps the door open, the lights on, and the kettle warm for men and women in Ireland with absolutely nowhere left to turn. But what's really inside Riverbank? An amazing breadth of services that puts hope and help on every floor, because of you...



**SECOND FLOOR:** So that no one is forgotten...

#### Second Floor Services – **Brighter Tomorrows**

- Ending the Homelessness Cycle, Early: One of the only services of its kind in the country, Young Person's Support at MQI is 100% funded by donors and helps hundreds of men and women, as young as eighteen, out of homelessness and addiction.
- **A Vital Link:** Homeless people are among the most isolated in the country, so it's no wonder they suffer from mental illnesses like depression and anxiety that can lead to or worsen addiction. Here on the second floor, Ireland's first mental health service for homeless people was started by and is sustained thanks to supporters like you – a vital link at a critical time.

#### **He Could Have Been Anyone's Son**

You just feel pure empty. When everybody is going home, knowing you'll be on your own on the street thinking, 'There is no way I can hold down this job.' Nowhere to sleep,

nowhere to shower, my feet in bits, and I still have to work tomorrow. It can happen to anyone, literally anyone. Without Young Person's Support at MQI, I'd have given up. 77 — Paul, aged 23, now in accommodation



f tomorrow you found yourself homeless, there is one thing we know. It will take just Yesterday I had no appointments in the ninety days for your mental health to slide – and maybe, turn to a way to numb the shock of street life. "The fact that because

of supporters we are the first mental health team opening our door to people who are homeless and struggling with mental illness and addiction, it's amazing. afternoon and I ended up seeing three people in two hours," explains mental health team member Raul. "There is a huge demand."

FIRST FLOOR: A step up, out of homelessness, despair, and addiction...

#### First Floor Services -**Practical Pathways**

- Tending the Sick and the Wounded: From bandaging feet to treating chronic illness, in the first-floor medical service, you help bring relief to all.
- **Pain-Free Smiles and New** Self-Esteem: When addiction and homelessness take a toll on teeth. the dental service you help fund lets clients face the world again.
- **Hope in Addiction's Dark Days:** MQI needle exchange, offered without judgement, keeps streets safer and builds a bridge to recovery

Life Skills, Learning, and More:

Needs constantly change at Riverbank. But the first-floor multipurpose room lets your donations do double duty for Ireland's most vulnerable,

expanding Night Café capacity in the wee hours, and serving as a computer, training, and therapy room during the daytime.

## 30 Seconds with Riverbank's Dental Care Team

**Q**: Are clients ever embarrassed to have you see their teeth in a bad state?

Niamh (Dentist, 100% donor-funded!): Always. And ashamed. They're scared – they're in pain – but they still apologise for the state of their teeth.

O: How do you let them know it's OK?

**Triona (HSE Dental Nurse):** We give them a bit of a hug or a pat on the back. Yesterday we saw a client who told us he was having suicidal thoughts as well. The services are all joined up here, thanks to the support of MQI donors. It's massive.



#### The True Impact of Needle **Exchange**

e could have been a sad statistic. But all through addiction's dark days, MQI's needle exchange protected his basic health until he was ready to work on recovery. Years later, drug-free, he wrote to say thank you: "I've two beautiful sons. I've a beautiful wife. If I'd had HIV or Hepatitis C from risky injecting, I would never have had a chance with that girl. Now I'm married to her." In changing the lives that others dismiss, you change the future.

## GROUND FLOOR: It all starts with a cup of tea and an open door...

#### **Ground Floor Services –** Life's Basics

- **A Warm Welcome:** Thousands of times each week vulnerable men and women check in at our reception desk, to a smile and a friendly face
- A Cup of Tea and a Meal: Day or night, MQI's donor-funded food service offers sustenance for those who mightn't otherwise eat
- Clean, Dry Clothing: With your help, as often as we can, clean, dry socks and underwear are given to those who need them
- Dignity and a Hot Shower: When you're cold and street-weary, the privacy of a clean bathroom and a hot shower restores dignity
- Free Phones: For many clients, ringing for even a chance at a hostel bed would be impossible without the free phones
- The Shelter of the Night Café:

At 11pm, mats are rolled out in Riverbank for 70 people. If not for this bit of shelter they would sleep on the


## **Frozen Footprints**








Could you spare any of the following this summer? When supplies are low, even the simplest gift speaks volumes to those we serve:
